Dear Cluster Family,

The suicide of Jack Gallagher on February 6th has left profound shock, sadness and anger in its wake in Dryden and beyond. Jack was a promising student at Dryden High School. Well-liked and gifted, he also faced suffering. What can one think, other than to conclude that in order to commit suicide a person must have to have been in profound distress... and that the mercy and justice of God knows that distress even better than Jack did, and that God knows how to ask into and answer that distress, answer and fill it-- even after the trigger is pulled?

Being new to the area, I hadn't met Jack. Even so, I find myself profoundly affected by his death. Please allow me to propose to you a thought that is as worthy of our consideration as it is unpleasant.

To be frank and blunt, Jack's death has made me ask myself: just how far I am, how far are any of us, really, from going home, unlocking our own twelve-gauges and killing ourselves?

Please don't misunderstand: I am not expressing suicidal intentions, so don't have me committed for psychiatric observation. What I **am** asking is, really, are we all as far as we may think we are from doing the same thing?

We probably will say, "never in a million years!", or respond that God's presence to us, or the care of loved ones would prevent it. But I cannot believe that God was not present to Jack, or that he did not have loved ones.

Jack's death is a warning to us.

First and foremost, it's a challenge to trust that the life, death and resurrection of Jesus are powerful enough to bring something good out of even such a horror as suicide. I'll bet my bottom dollar that God did not will this to happen. But God will supply all that this situation needs in order to be put right.

But, like I said, this is also a warning to you and me. A warning against **HIDDEN DESPAIR** (as well as not-so-hidden despair). Hidden despair can creep up on any of us, and one day snap the neck of our soul before we knew what hit us. This is the M.O. of our enemy, who hates relationships of any kind.

If we think we're not vulnerable to hidden despair because we're "healthy," remember that Jack seemed quite healthy: popular, successful, etc. Perhaps his pain was hidden. Perhaps so is yours and mine.

I don't know about you, but for me, Jack's death is an alarm bell saying, "*You're not as invulnerable as you think! This is your wake-up call, make an audit of your sadness or despair that you might not even have realized is there! Ask God into it! Take it to a qualified mental health helper and a spiritual guide! Unmask the secrecy that is the fog that lets despair in to rob you of your peace!!!*".

This warning is all the more timely if the cause of our despair causes us to feel marginalized in our relationship with God, the Church, our community or our family. God may be propelling us to new life through such a look at our despair, aided by a qualified helper.

As we mourn Jack's death, let's dare to believe that God's love is big enough even for this. And, let us take the warning and get help against our own demons. We're blind if we think there's some special exemption to prevent your or me from being next. **BLIND.** We might not bear Jack's particular sufferings, but we bear our own.

May God pour forth peace and healing upon the Gallaghers and upon us all. May Jack rest in peace and may we see him in joy at the Resurrection. And may we have ears to hear the warning for our own lives.

[...] Grave psychological disturbances, anguish, or grave fear of hardship [...] can diminish the responsibility of the one committing suicide.

We should not despair of the eternal salvation of persons who have taken their own lives. By ways known to him alone, God can provide the opportunity for salutary repentance. The Church prays for persons who have taken their own lives.

--Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos. 2282, 2283

Let us aid Jack with our prayer, and ask him to aid us with his.

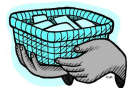

Why do we still celebrate Ash Wednesday on a Wednesday? We've moved Ascension Thursday to the following Sunday. Why not this too?

Dear Margaret,

Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox (first day of spring). *Lent*, derived from a word meaning "spring," refers to the forty-day penitential season determined each year by counting backward from the date of Easter. "Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday to the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive" (General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, 28; Pope Paul VI, 1969). The six Sundays in Lent are excluded from the count, since each represents a "mini- Easter."

While some rites calculate the days of Lent differently, in Western Christianity Lent was transferred to a Wednesday to align the number of days of Lent to the forty days Jesus fasted in the wilderness (see Matthew 4:1-2).

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence that begins a period of prayer, penance, and almsgiving in preparation for Easter, but it's never been a holy day of obligation. An obligatory holy day like the Ascension can be transferred to a Sunday, "the primordial holy day of obligation" in the universal Church, only by the national conferences of bishops "with the prior approval of the Apostolic See" (Code of Canon Law, 1246).
