Please note the following:

TRIDUUM LITURGIES ALL IN ONE PLACE BEGINNING THIS YEAR

Beginning this year, the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) liturgy will be celebrated in a single church in our three-parish cluster. Reason: Bishop Clark directs that the Triduum be celebrated in one and only one place in any group of "clustered" parishes like ours. Reason for this reason: they really aren't three separate liturgies, but one continuous liturgy spread out over three days.

The Triduum will be celebrated at Holy Cross this year; at St. Anthony's in 2013; at All Saints in 2014. (There will be Easter Sunday Masses in the other two churches, where the Triduum liturgies aren't celebrated, each year. Additional Masses may be scheduled if guest priests are available).

WHY LET IT GO ANY LONGER?

If you or a loved one have not yet been baptized or confirmed, why not make this the year? Please call me at 844-8314. Why keep missing out on the power of these sacraments to help you be fully alive?

HOW DARE YOU SUGGEST THAT MY CHILD...

If you wonder how I dare to constantly propose that we encourage our young people to consider pastoral ministry as a possible vocation/career, in a Church that seems to suffer *profound* dysfunction in our country, invite me out for a cup of coffee and I'll tell you.

CONFESSIONS DURING RETREAT IN LIEU OF PENANCE SERVICE THIS LENT

We will be having a cluster-wide Lenten retreat this year, during which the retreat master (a guest priest) will be available extensively for private conversations and confession in all three churches. These extra opportunities to go to confession will be presented in lieu of the usual Lenten penance service. More information to come, once we confirm the dates and itinerary for the retreat master.

What is Candlemas?

My mother always went to church on Candlemas because she thought the candlelit procession was so beautiful. I haven't heard the name Candlemas in years. Do we still celebrate it? Velma Mary

Dear Velma Mary,

Candlemas falls on February 2, forty days after Christmas. It's a popular name for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which recalls the day Mary and Joseph presented their child to God in the temple at Jerusalem in accordance with the law of Moses. We remember how the elderly believers, Simeon and Anna, recognized Jesus as their longed-for Messiah and how, addressing God in a canticle (song), Simeon proclaimed Christ to be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel" (Luke 2:29-32).

On the Feast of the Presentation, Mass starts with a blessing and the lighting of candles, which the priest and people carry either in procession or in a solemn entrance into the church. They rejoice over the Good News of Christ—the light of the nations—entering the world. The name *Candlemas* springs from this ritual blessing of candles.

In 1997, Pope John Paul II added an extra layer of meaning to Candlemas by proclaiming the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord to also be the annual World Day for Consecrated Life. Now many religious brothers, sisters, and priests mark the day as a moment for renewing their vows of religious consecration and celebrating their special vocation within the Church.

- Is currently a high school senior.

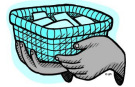
